I urge you to take advantage of the numerous opportunities to invest in Montana Angus genetics this fall. There will be plenty of bull and females sales from which to choose.







RETIREMENT DISPERSION





Hello Again from North Central Montana,
What a wild ride this state has experienced in the
last 12-18 months. We've had widespread drought, flooding
events, explosive hay prices (and fuel, fertilizer and other
inputs), volatile cow markets & I'm sure I'm missing many
others...

One thing is certain in this profession we call agriculture; we never stop receiving opportunities to learn. But I for one, am ready for things to calm down a touch!

In the midst of this unruly season, we've decided to put a new spin on the DVM Dialogue column and ask for questions from our readers and producers. I will continue this segment for the remainder of the publication season (or until we run out of questions).

The first question we received was:

What are your thoughts on giving a live vaccine to pregnant cows?

And

What are your thoughts on different pre-conditioning protocols?

What a great question for this season, so lets see if I can get you some answers!

MODIFIED LIVE VACCINES IN PREGNANT ANIMALS

In the last decade or two of veterinary medicine, we have tweaked our recommendations to producers about annual vaccine protocols in our cow herds. I feel it is an important question to address as new research comes available and as we receive disease pressures on our cow herds. There are many facets to this question and I welcome specific questions from producers on this topic, but for the sake of word count I am just going to address what I feel is the best case scenario for herds and why I recommend the protocol.

Modified Live vaccines (MLV) shine in their activation of the immune system and their duration of immunity. They hold an important place in a herd's vaccine protocol to prime immune systems for annual vaccination later in life. I recommend the use of MLV's in young stock (branding, preconditioning/weaning, and post weaning development). I recommend to my producers to use modified live vaccines at branding, precon/weaning and then 1-2 boosters during their development period prior to their first breeding season. It is important that bulls receive their last modified live vaccine no later than 60 days prior to their first bull test or breeding and that heifers receive their last modified live vaccine ideally no later than 40 days prior to their first breeding. This is important because MLV's can cause altered semen and oocyte production and decreased fertility within these windows of time.

Annual vaccination of the cow herd can be done safely and effectively using a hybrid vaccine product or killed vaccine product, in the fall, at pregnancy diagnosis. Another option is to administer a MLV booster annually to the cow herd in the spring, within a safe time frame prior to breeding (ex: branding time). It is important to note that some research suggests there is a benefit to utilizing both MLV and hybrid/killed vaccine products in a cow herd protocol, as a stronger immunity may be elicited by activating the immune system with different products.

The vast majority of my producers utilize a MLV priming in their youngstock and then annual vaccination of their cowherd with a hybrid vaccine product and I have been very happy with the safety and efficacy of this protocol.

PRE-CONDITIONING PROTOCOLS

When people call to order their pre-conditioning vaccines, I usually run through a list of questions to find the best fit for their operation and current situation.

I'll run through the list of questions and the comprehensive options available to answer the questions. At the end of the segment, I will put together a few of the most commonly utilized protocols in my practice.

1. Have you contracted your calves?

- a. This is the most important question to consider when selecting pre-conditioning vaccines. Calf contract obligations often guide our choices for vaccine selection. The most common requirements for contracts are:
 - i. 2 doses of a "blackleg" product Most commonly calves are on one of 2 programs:
 - 1. They receive a self-boosting type product at birth (ex: Alpha 7) and a booster at preconditioning (ex: Vision, UltraBac).
 - 2. They receive a product at branding and a booster of the same product at preconditioning (ex: Vision, UltraBac).

***It is important to note that often calf contracts dictate that the "blackleg" pre-conditioning booster contains a Somnus component. I am comfortable with calves receiving an initial somnus vaccine at pre-conditioning time, but do not typically vaccinate younger calves (birth or branding age calves) with a somnus combination vaccine.

- ii. 2 doses of a viral "5-way" vaccine (IBR, PI3, BRSV and BVD I and II)
 - 1. Calves receive an intranasal vaccine at birth (ex: InForce 3), a booster at branding along with a BVD vaccine and then a booster of the 5-way viral at preconditioning.
 - 2. Calves receive an intranasal and BVD vaccine at branding and a booster of the 5-way viral at pre-conditioning.
 - 3. Calves receive a 5-way viral at branding and pre-conditioning.
- ***Intranasal vaccine technology offers the benefit of being easier on the calf and a "prevention of infection" vaccine claim – meaning the vaccine actually prevents viral infection by neutralizing and expelling it before it can take hold in a calf's system.
 - iii. 1 or 2 doses of a Pasturella vaccine
 - 1. Calves receive a pasturella vaccine at branding and preconditioning.
 - 2. Calves receive a vaccine at preconditioning.
 - iv. Adjunctive products to consider
 - 1. Growth Implants with good feed resources, these products may add pounds to your calves. Growth implants are prohibited for "all natural" calf sales.
 - 2. MultiMin a injectable multi-mineral supplement that boosts minerals important for calf health.
 - 3. Internal parasite control injectable and oral dewormers typically do a better job at parasite control when compared to pouron formulations. Calves tend to benefit from injectable products if preconditioning occurs 4 -6 weeks prior to marketing.
 - 4. External parasite control pour-on fly control is very helpful around preconditioning time, because fly stress can drastically limit growth during the summer period prior to marketing.

2. How is your calf health? What is the environment like?

- a. I am more likely to recommend intranasal vaccine products with dry/dusty conditions. Intranasal vaccines offer protection as soon as 3 days after administration. Injectable vaccines take 10 days or longer to build an immune response and offer protection.
- b. If calves are fighting particular issues (summer pneumonia, lack of thriftiness, pink-eye), I may add on adjunctive products or vaccinations at the time of pre-conditioning to optimize the "chute time" for the producer.

3. Are you retaining ownership after weaning?

- a. Seedstock Producers developing replacement females or bulls need to consult about the long-term affects of vaccines and pharmaceuticals used at pre-conditioning and integrate them into a long-term health protocol.
- b. Producers retaining ownership after weaning in the feedlot may also benefit from more products as a long-term investment for growth and performance.

Example Protocol #1 ("seedstock" protocol)

- Birth self boosting "blackleg" product (ex: Alpha 7), intranasal vaccine (ex: InForce 3)
- Branding Intranasal vaccine, BVD/Pasturella combination vaccine
- Preconditioning 5-way viral/pasturella combination vaccine, "blackleg" booster, with somnus (ex: Vision + Somnus, Ultrabac + Somnus) injectable dewormer, fly control
- Weaning typically nothing, but may boost an intranasal product if conditions are exceptionally dusty or if calf health is borderline/fighting summer pneumonia issues.

Example Protocol #2 ("cow/calf" commercial protocol)

- Birth self boosting "blackleg" product
- Branding Intranasal vaccine, BVD/Pasturella combination vaccine
- Preconditioning 5-way viral/pasturella combination vaccine, "blackleg" booster, with somnus (ex: Vision + Somnus, Ultrabac + Somnus), fly control +/injectable dewormer
- If conditions are dusty or if summer pneumonia is a problem, I opt for a repeat of the branding intranasal and BVD/Pasturella combination vaccine to get a quicker immune response to the respiratory problems.

Just remember – there is an endless combination of products and solutions for your herd. Working with your veterinarian to develop a protocol that works for your operation is the best way to ensure a successful herd health program.

Also remember – NUTRITION NUTRITION NUTRITION!!! Vaccines are only effective if the calf and cow health and immune system is capable of responding to them. Nutrition and trace mineral balance is the key factor that drives success for any operation.



Greetings from MSU Angus! School may just be getting back into session, but MSU Angus has been down to business all summer. The MSU Angus team was hard at work branding calves, assisting with embryo transfers, and breeding cows. We had a great summer, and hope you all did as well!

On July 14th, the MSU Angus team worked with Gary Porter (ET technician) to transfer embryos into recipient cows. Of our 48 synchronized recipients, we were pleased to have 42 of them receive embryos. Embryos included some that were purchased this spring while others were donated by Gartner Denowh Angus Ranch, Madrid Angus, and MLK Angus. Matings include Montana Donna 9102 x Coleman Rock 7200, Coleman Donna 7233 x SITZ Stellar 726D, SAV Montana Rita 7068 x Brooking Can Am 8812, GDAR Miss Wix 8161 x Ellingson Rangeland, SITZ Florabelle Fanny 5033 x SITZ Logo 12964, SITZ Miss Burgess 734X x Mytty Source 4082, Northfork Ellunas Elite 8137 x SITZ Dash 10277, and SITZ Eisa Evergreen 1824 x HA Cowboy Up. We were excited to have MSU Angus board member, Tim Skinner, there to assist with thawing embryos and work with the team. It was a great day, and we are looking forward to seeing these embryos as calves on the ground next spring.

MSU Angus bred the females during late July. We artificially inseminated 92 heifers (31 registered heifers) on July 21st at the BART Farm, and we artificially inseminated 136 cows (47 registered cows) on July 28th at Red Bluff. Dr. Tim DelCurto and Dr. McCoski assisted with thawing straws while Red Bluff Foreman Noah Davis, Town Livestock Foreman Danielle Duni, graduate student Andrea Rutledge, and other eager graduate students Al'd. As we all know, ranching is a team sport, and we had a great crew to help with the process. The commercial

heifers were bred to Sydgen Stealth 8556, and the registered heifers were bred to HA Cowboy Kind 8137 and Deer Valley Unique 5635. The commercial cows were bred to Holden Advance 8132F, and the registered cows were individually mated by Dr. Tim, Taylre, and incoming graduate student manager, Thomas Hamiliton. These cows were bred to SITZ Logo 8148, SITZ Prodigy 12000, or SITZ Resilient 10208. Three MSU raised herd bulls - 2 sired by Coleman Marshall (AAA +*20150566 and +*20150564) and 1 sired by 44 Bragging Rights (AAA *20395459) were turned out with the heifers, and bulls Stevenson Templeton 80548 and Stevenson Hallmark 80711 were turned with the cows post AI. We are looking forward to the upcoming preg checking and weaning season and wishing everyone pregnant cow vibes and heavy weaning weights.

The MSU Angus program is so fortunate to receive such tremendous support from our Montana Angus producers. Thank you for encouraging the program!

Hello Montana Angus,

My name is Garrett Jones and I recently finished my Junior year in the Ag business/Ag Economics program at Montana State University. I grew up on a small farm and feedlot and have helped my family develop a commercial and registered Angus cow-calf operation south of Miles City, Montana This upbringing has given me an appreciation and broader understanding of the cattle industry and the commercial cattle owner's needs. Having knowledge of the commercial cattle business allows me better understand the functional and desirable traits that need to be expressed in my own herd.

Like most places in Montana, I grew up in an area where the majority of the commercial cowherd is Angus-based. This made me realize the many benefits of the breed that eventually persuaded me to get into registered Angus. The strong maternal ability of the Angus female is what drives many producers to build a cowherd around the breed. The interesting thing about Angus cattle to me is the broad diversity of options customers have within the breed itself. For example, I am fascinated that



some programs target maternal qualities while another program seeks performance and pounds yet a third focuses primarily for end product merit and some programs' main goal is presentation and phenotype. Certainly, this diversity creates controversy for those producers who are passionate about their specific program of developing cattle, but I believe diversity allows the breed to have a robust customer base and large market share of the cattle industry. I appreciate the flexibility that allows the commercial cattleman to be able to drive down the road and look at one set of cows or bulls, and then drive a little farther and look at a completely different set that might fit their style better.

Another attraction of the Angus breed in Montana a is not only the superior quality, but also the great quantity of Angus genetics in the state. The addition of the Angus program paired with other opportunities at Montana State allows kids who are interested in the industry to meet current and future people in the business. Being around other people in the industry is what originally drew me towards going to school at Montana State University, while also being within driving distance of many nationally recognized Angus operations, bull studs, and lesser-known Angus cattle herds with equally high-quality stock. I believe the intense competition for Angus customers is what drives the breed to be better with each new calf crop.

The maternal Angus cow is what originally inspired me about the breed and is what I will continue to focus on in my own herd. However, the consistent amount of quality and diverse genetics is what brings many people to the breed. At the end of the day, if you don't like what you see at one place, all you have to do is drive down the road to find something different.

Andy and Kindle were blessed with a son, Jackson Wacey, on August 17, 2015 Andy was a very proud dad, and like everything else he did, he gave his parenting job 100 percent.
