



H appy New Year from North Central Montana! As 2023 comes to a close and we move into a new year, we are sure happy to see some moisture headed our way. The fall of 2023 blessed us with beautiful temperatures and very mild weather patterns, allowing us all some much needed time to wrap up fall projects. But winter was long overdue, and it appears it is finally here!

As I drove down the road between appointments this fall, I was left with a lot of time to ponder the last few years. I started to write down a few thoughts, and after a time, I had enough things written down it turned into an article. What follows is more a set of ramblings meant to bring about thought and conversation with your neighbors, your veterinarian and your nutritionist. With the hopes that maybe next drought cycle we'll be able to start mitigating it sooner and lessen the impact we feel.

Things the drought taught me

1. There is NO substitute for good feed. This is my #1 for a reason. I think we've all heard the saying "you can't starve a profit out of a cow." While this is certainly true, the drought also taught me the true VALUE in the differences of QUALITY in feedstuffs. We were all hit by several angles the last few years. Unable to put up the normal hay quantities, and the drought was widespread enough that we had to go a substantial distance to purchase hay, fuel prices/mileage decreased the available funds to purchase feed, and what little hay we did put up was of poorer quality. My observation is that there is no supplement on the market that can fill the gap created by poor quality forage. Many do a good job at getting a cow herd through the rough patch, but the difference in cow condition and health on good quality dormant forage and good quality hay in adequate quantities is profound.

2. We can't short a cows' nutritional needs without consequences. Even the very best cowherds, bred to endure our extreme Montana environments, faltered under the conditions we endured the last few years. Decreased conception rates, lower weaning weights, poorer calf health, we saw it all. My observation is that it was a direct consequence of the quantity and quality of feedstuffs available. Producers that worked hard at balancing their rations didn't escape the effects of the drought, but they were able to mitigate some of the consequences and they recovered sooner from its effects.

3. It is important to be able to evaluate Body Condition Score (BCS). My observation is that the skill at judging your herd's BCS throughout the year is extremely valuable at catching problems before they become wrecks. There is a big difference between BCS and gut fill – and when feeding poor quality feedstuffs – this difference becomes very important to recognize.

4. When balancing a ration, remember, Energy-Protein-Macro and Trace minerals. I saw deficiencies in all 4 of these categories throughout the drought period. They all manifested in different ways; altered fertility, poorer weaning weights, down cows, higher mortality of cows and calves during the calving period, less vigorous calves. My observation is we can't forget about any one of these categories without consequences. A nutritionist is such a valuable asset to any operation and a balanced ration is so important. Once clinical issues are being seen, it takes weeks of correcting the feed to start seeing things turn around. And some of the production consequences may be seen far longer down the road.

5. Forage sampling. An integral tool in regards to above items 1, 2, 3 & 4.

6. Fly control. Last year was unprecedented in my lifetime when it came to the severe fly issues we saw in cowherds across the state and beyond. Even in my personal cow herd, I felt I mismanaged the problem. Moving into 2024, I am working on a herd plan involving strategic injectable and pour on products, in combination with rubbers and feed through fly prevention. I hope we don't need it, but I want to be prepared if we do.

7. Parasite management can be integral in drought stressed cows and calves. We were able to turn around a lot of herd health issues by implementing a simple deworming strategy. The drought really emphasized the importance of strategic deworming on herd health and performance.

8. Reproductive tract scoring can be valuable in identifying eligible females. Most herds have a good system for identifying replacement quality heifers. But drought stricken heifers can have altered fertility, and in these situations, the use of reproductive tract scoring can identify females that are not able to respond to synchronization protocols or that are not ready for the breeding season. This in turn can be used to manage replacements differently and help conserve expenses.

I have spent a great deal of time working through some very harrowing times with people that mean a lot to me the last few years. This drought cycle has been very taxing on everyone. I had several producers asking the question "Why are my cows so much different than

Grandpa's." And I believe there are a lot of things to unpack about this statement. Yes – a lot of cows survived on a ration with straw and without supplements/dewormers/health plans in decades gone by. But, in a conversation this fall, with a trusted "Grandpa" in my life, I had the epiphany of the things I think are most different when comparing then vs now. He was telling me how much he prided himself on his powers of observation, and a thing I deeply respect about this man is the time he takes in what he does. He does not rush, and he takes time to watch and ponder things. He often brings things to my attention, and I learn a lot in our conversations together. My epiphany is this; cow herds are much larger now, and we as ranchers are much "busier." Many of us have had to diversify, wearing many hats to keep the bills paid. But there is no substitute for spending time with your cow herd and observing – are they content, are their patterns normal, is their condition adequate? And with larger herds, I think it is an even more challenging task to manage the details and observe the little things that may make the biggest differences.

Praying for some good moisture and a reprieve in the temperatures as the calves start hitting the ground!



"Legacy. It's one word, but has deep meaning in my family."

Nicole Stevenson on how her family legacy has impacted her life

The Oxford Dictionary defines a legacy as "the longlasting impact of particular events, actions, etc. that took place in the past, or of a person's life."

Legacies often come from humble beginnings. With little more than a small loan from a local bank, three children and a dream, my grandparents - Wayne and Marian Stevenson - founded Basin Angus Ranch. They never would have imagined that 50 years after its creation, their dream would grow to be such a source of pride for our family. They would also be glad to know the Angus breed is still at the heart of it.

At a yound age, my father, Doug Stevenson, developed a passion for raising Angus cattle while working alongside his parents. That passion led him to run for a spot on the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) board of directors; in 1984, he was elected to the junior board, adding to our family's Angus legacy.

When I earned my own green coat as an NJAA director 37 years later, I was ecstatic. It is a blessing to follow in my father's footsteps and continue our family legacy of dedication to the breed. A year into my term, I was honored with the opportunity to serve as chairman of the board. As

I walked alongside my parents at the 2023 National Junior Angus Show closing ceremonies, I was filled with emotions. I was looking back not only at my time serving the junior association, but also at the foundation my father and his fellow directors created during their years of service. I was overwhelmed with gratitude for what the breed has given back to my family and for the time we have spent serving it. This breed has given me much: lifelong connections, memories of spending time together doing what we love, and support along the way.

Just as my father did. I began working on the ranch alongside my parents throughout my teenage years. Sharing their love of this lifestyle, I quickly jumped in to start learning more of the ins and outs of the industry and our operation. My passion for our cowherd drove me back home after graduation from Montana State University in 2021. The People Behind the Montana Beef Council New officers elected will lead the council to increased beef demand

In action concluding its December 18 meeting in Billings, the Montana Beef Council (MBC) elected new leadership that will guide the council for the next two years. Andy Kellom from Hobson, Mont. will serve as president and Travis Choat from Terry, Mont. will serve as vice president. The MBC Board of Directors are all Montana volunteers, representing nearly all segments of the beef supply chain.

"I am confident in the programs that our board has funded and our mission to help build beef demand. The Montana Beef Council is doing that for Montana's ranchers, and we have been since 1954. Consumers want delicious and nutritious beef. We're making sure that happens," says Kellom, who was appointed to serve on the council in 2017 by the Montana Cattle Feeders. "I have a cattle and cattle feeder operation in Central Montana, and, being involved on this board, I am proud of the work we've set forth. I encourage fellow ranchers to take some time to learn more about all the projects we do."

The new fiscal year began Oct. 1 and programs will be funded with beef checkoff dollars collected from Montana producers. The Montana Beef Council budgeted \$40,700 for in-state consumer information programs, \$146,500 for instate beef promotion activities, \$13,250 for in-state industry information activities, \$61,500 for producer communication efforts, \$144,00 for domestic marketing and \$135,000 for international beef marketing. Remaining anticipated expenses funded through the budget include \$479,659 for mandatory collection expenses, administration, USDA oversight, program implementation, annual auditing, Department of Livestock expenses, in-state travel and office expenses.


"I am proud of the work our board has set forth and I encourage fellow ranchers to take some time to learn more about all the projects we do," said Choat, who stepped into his role with the council in 2018 after being appointed by the Montana Stockgrowers Association. Choat and his wife own and operate Homestead Cattle Company, where they have raised crops and cattle for eleven years. "We're here as representatives of Montana cattlemen and beef producers to do our best to direct the dollars entrusted to us to enhance opportunities to drive the demand for beef. There's an open door here. We are always looking for input, and the office and board room are open for a reason."



Association leadership selected for 2024 at the Annual Convention of Delegates

The 140th Annual Convention of Delegates for the American Angus Association® assembled November 6 in Orlando, Florida. Five members were re-elected to the board of directors for a second term. They are Mark Ahearn, Wills Point, Texas; Smitty Lamb, Tifton, Georgia; Charles Mogck, Olivet, South Dakota; Darrell Stevenson, White Sulphur Springs, Montana; and Jerry Theis, Leavenworth, Kansas. The officers of the board were also elected.

Elected officers are Barry Pollard, Enid, Oklahoma, president and chairman of the board and Jonathan Perry, Fayetteville, Tennessee, vice president and vice chairman of the board. Jim Brinkley, Milan, Missouri will serve as the treasurer for the 2023 to 2024 term.

"I look forward to working with the board and the membership in general, and the staff as well," said newly elected Pollard. "We have such talented people all across that at every level, and we want to hear their ideas. We want to hear how the things we've done for them genetically or EPDs are benefiting their herd and what questions they have."

Directors can serve up to two three-year terms on the board and, if elected, they serve an additional one-year term in office as president/chairman and/or vice president/ vice chairman. More about the re-elected directors:

Ahearn was raised on a small family farm with commercial cattle and a few horses. After spending some time away from cattle production, Ahearn and his family established Turner Meadow Ranch in East Texas in the mid-1980s. Aside from his 35-year career in law enforcement, Ahearn said his passion has always been raising highquality Angus cattle. He has studied pedigrees and learned the business from the ground up. His family has grown their herd to about 200 females. Before serving his first term on the Association's board of directors, Ahearn served in a leadership role with the Texas Angus Association for 16 years through which he helped create numerous educational opportunities and organize sale events. Ahearn was also responsible for writing the policy for the Raymond Moore Endowment Scholarship Fund, which benefits Texas Junior Angus members. He said he has a strong desire to continue serving the membership and to give back to the organization.

Lamb grew up on small farm in East Georgia, where he discovered his passion for Angus cattle at an early age. His passion led him to the University of Georgia where he earned a bachelor's degree in animal science and a master's degree in meat and muscle biology. Currently, Lamb works as a cotton merchant for a large commodity trading company and enjoys coming home to his Angus cattle herd. His family has owned and operated Ogeechee Angus Farm

since 1997, Since 2017, Ogeechee Angus Farm has marketed more than 100 bulls annually; and this past spring, Ogeechee Angus hosted their 16th annual Angus Female Southern Synergy Sale. Aside from his time on the Association's board of directors, Lamb has served in leadership roles with the Georgia Angus Association, the Southern National Angus Show committee, and the National Junior Angus Show, serving as its committee co-chair in 2009. The Lambs were awarded the Georgia Angus Association Member of the Year in 2017 for their service to the organization.

Mogck is a third-generation Angus breeder from South Dakota. Mogck has always had a passion for Angus cattle and has built upon his family's heritage in the breed, increasing their herd to 400 registered females. He began

his career as a loan officer after attending South Dakota State University, but eventually he found himself working on the farm full-time. Today, Mogck & Sons Angus markets 120 bulls and 50 females annually. They farm 2,000 acres of corn, beans and wheat with an additional 2,500 acres of pasture and hay ground. They also routinely buy feeder cattle from their commercial customers, allowing them to collect data on their customers' cattle. Their operation actively utilizes Association programs such



as MaternalPlus[®] and Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR[®]). Mogck records ultrasound, carcass and genomic information to help them make the best decisions they can for the future of their herd. Mogck's deep roots with respect to Angus cattle and enthusiasm for the breed shows through his dedication as a director on the Association's board of directors.

Stevenson holds strong ties to the Angus breed and a history of activity in the Montana Angus Association. Stevenson's grandparents were charter members of the Montana Angus Association, and his father was on the state and national Association's board of directors as well, serving as president from 1992-1993. Stevenson attended Montana State University before transferring to and graduating from Oklahoma State University. He now continues his family's legacy by operating Stevenson Angus Ranch. He is actively involved in international Angus events and has attended shows in Argentina, New Zealand, Scotland and Russia. In 2010, Stevenson created a partnership with two Russian businessmen to form an international beef venture between the two countries. Due to its success, Stevenson has since overseen shipments of Angus cattle to Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Uzbekistan. His experience and history with the Angus breed led him to serve the organization on the Association's board of directors for the past three years.

Theis is a devoted secondgeneration Angus breeder and lifetime member of the Association. His parents established April Valley Farms in 1952 in the Salt Creek Valley of Leavenworth County, Kansas. Theis graduated as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

from Kansas State University in 1991. He currently works at a local veterinary clinic while he manages his family's diversified operation, which consists of Angus cattle and crop and swine production. Cattle are marketed through their annual spring production sale as well as through private treaties. April Valley Farms was recognized as a Historic Angus Herd by the Association in 2019. Theis and his wife are actively involved in the Kansas Angus Association as well, and just completed their second term as the Kansas Junior Angus Association advisors. Prior to his current position as a director on the national organization's board of directors, Theis served two terms on the Kansas Angus Association board of directors and as president in 2010.





The team at the Montana State University Angus Program would like to wish you all a happy new year! Over the past year we have continued to grow and improve the registered Angus herd at MSU, with the support of our team and the help of other Montana breeders. With the new year comes many things to look forward to as calving season for most will occur over the next several months as well as many bull sales across the state.

The Montana State Angus Program will again be attending the Treasure State Bull Test where we will market a group of older bulls many of which sired by HA Cowboy Kind and Sitz Logo 8148. I was able to stop by the bull test after attending the Bobcat Angus bull sale and was very impressed with how the bulls are coming along and the quality of bulls from other consignors, it looks like the bull test should have a very strong offering this coming spring and Ryan and the crew are doing a great job developing these bulls.

The registered and commercial herd at Montana State will again be part of a study this winter at the Red Bluff Research ranch located near Norris, MT. The study will be evaluating the impacts of protein supplementation on thermoregulation, grazing behavior, cow performance, subsequent calf performance, as well as breeding efficiency. These cows will be fed three varying levels of protein supplement level (alfalfa pellet) three days weekly while grazing native rangeland throughout the winter. This work is aimed to help producers who wish to reduce feed cost throughout the winter months by extending the grazing period of their operation.

This past year, we published two peer-reviewed publication on feet and leg scoring of Angus cattle (Taylre Sitz was the lead author on both papers). In addition, we are currently working with data sets to further look at feet and leg scores as well as pulmonary arterial pressure (PAP) and Angus bull performance, birth weight, gestation length, and production expected progeny differences (EPDs). In addition, we are currently evaluating registered Angus cow performance, grazing distribution and behavior as influenced by feet and leg scores. We will share this information with membership as these studies progress.

We are looking forward to a busy winter here at MSU and look forward to seeing you all at various bull sales and events over the next month. Please feel free to reach out with any questions in regard to the MSU Angus Program or any research mentioned above. Thank you all again for the continued support of this program and the opportunities it provides the undergraduate and graduate students of Montana State University.



Raised with Respect[™] Cattle Care Campaign Launched This Fall Certified Angus Beef and Sysco join forces to support farmers and ranchers,

the beef community as a whole

Respect for animals, respect for the land and respect for each other – the foundation of a new campaign from Sysco, the global leader in food service distribution, and Certified Angus Beef (CAB), a brand known for its commitment to quality beef. The campaign, Raised with Respect[™], centers on the common ground found between cattle producers and beef consumers, with a focus on animal welfare and beef sustainability.

Raised with Respect[™] was developed as part of a strategic cattle care partnership between Sysco and CAB. The collaboration focuses on supporting producers, equipping them with continuing education to stay current on best management practices and helping to increase consumer confidence in beef production.

Through the partnership, Sysco and CAB are providing Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) training and certification to farmers and ranchers in nine key cattle production states. To elevate the trainings, bringing dynamic educational opportunities to cattle country, Sysco and CAB are collaborating with state entities who also have a vested interest in BQA.

Launching at the 2023 Angus Convention in November, two campaign events were held in Orlando, Florida. Collaborating with Florida Beef Council and the American Angus Association, a BQA training was offered to educate and certify Angus ranchers. Another event, the BQA Bash,

celebrated the commitment of ranchers who are currently BQA-certified. Nearly 100 producers attended the training and more than 200 attended the BQA Bash.

Following Angus Convention, additional Raised with Respect[™] BQA trainings took place in Texas and Montana. The campaign will continue through June 2024, with the six remaining BQA trainings occurring in Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Missouri, Nebraska, and Oklahoma.

BQA, a nationally recognized education and certification program, encompasses the best practices for cattle care, including animal handling, nutrition and responsible use of antibiotics.

"Certified Angus Beef supports BQA because it's a credible and effective way for producers to communicate animal welfare to people on the opposite end of the beef supply chain." says Bruce Cobb, CAB executive vice president of production. "By building trust with this segment and consumers, we can help secure the strong beef demand we've been experiencing into the future."

According to research from NCBA (on behalf of the Beef Checkoff), 70% of consumers agreed that BQA certification increased their confidence in knowing the beef they eat is safe, and 67% agreed that it increased their confidence that cattle are humanely raised. Prior to learning about the program, 44% of consumers had positive perceptions about

> cattle production and that increased to 70% after learning of the BQA program.

Cattle producers interested in completing BQA training, but not able to attend an in-person event, are encouraged to complete the free course online. Navigating Challenges: The Shrinking Landscape of Livestock Producers in Agriculture

The livestock industry is grappling with a rising worry: the decline of livestock producers and the diminishing expanse of land in production agriculture. As an auction market owner, Joe Goggins, Angus breeder and Livestock Marketing Association (LMA) Board Member, has a front row seat to the continued loss of livestock producers and see it as a critical threat to the industry and our nation's food supply. Goggins brought the concerns about to the Montana Angus Association October Board Meeting. "There has been dispersion after dispersion after dispersion. We saw 15 full and complete dispersions come through last fall and there's been 10 more since. It looks like we'll have even more this fall with the way cattle prices are right now," stated Goggins.

The inventory report numbers from July report the facts. There are almost 6% less total cattle in the United States now than there was last year, and that number is the lowest it's been in 50 years. Despite recent record high livestock prices, it's still difficult for many to make ends meet. Lack of access to land and labor, over regulation, drought, and input costs are causing more people to exit the business while at the same time, preventing new producers from getting started. Not only are we losing more livestock producers than ever, but we're also losing the land used for grazing and forage production to recreation, development, conservation reserve programs, and crop production.

Livestock Marketing Association members have launched a 'Producer Profitability Initiative' which aims to bring all segments of the livestock industry together with a common goal in mind: industry sustainability. The Producer Profitability Initiative is a grassroots movement aimed at starting the conversation to create policy to strengthen producers' bottom lines and incentivize the next generation of livestock production and incentivize landowners to leave their land in livestock production. After seeing so many dispersals, the LMA felt it was time to unify all segments in the industry in some way to encourage these people to want to sustain the industry for future generations.

"By working together, we can all accomplish so much more than we can individually. We're not going to unify around all things, but I think we can unify as an industry around this," remarked Goggins.

Goggins continues to encourage producers of all sizes, types, and locations to reach out to those in their network and to the member organizations they are a part of to start conversations about the biggest barriers to profitability including: tax issues, lack of incentives for keeping land in livestock production, and competition for land and margin. Read more about the big issues below:

Tax Issues

We must fight to eliminate the estate tax, also known as the death tax, so farms and ranches can stay in the family, generation after generation. But at the very minimum, we need to keep the current estate tax cap, which will sunset in 2025.

We must also protect special use valuation methods available to agricultural landowners that allow property taxes to be calculated based on productive agricultural value, as opposed to market value of the land.

Creating incentives for keeping land in livestock production

If there were incentives for

keeping land for livestock and forage production, more new producers could enter the industry. This helps those who do not already own or lease land do so in a more affordable manner.

Creating opportunity to compete for land and margin

Existing programs such as Livestock Risk Protection (LRP), Conservation Reserve Program (CRP), Pasture Rangeland Forage (PRF) insurance program, and programs providing capital should be adjusted to allow livestock and forage producers to better compete with grain production for land.

How you can help

Moving forward, the Montana Angus Association supports Joe Goggins and the Producer Profitability Initiative and encourages its members to start these conversations with the producer organizations that they are a part of. The Montana Stockgrowers has recently passed policy on the above stated topics at their recent Annual Meeting.

By working together, all industry segments can accomplish so much more than working individually. This affects everyone – from the seedstock producers to their customers, to the guy who sells parts at the local Ace Hardware, and everyone in between. There is truly strength in numbers, and it will take us all to build a stronger, more sustainable livestock industry.

Every voice matters, and every conversation gets us a little closer to our goal.










The Department recently adopted new rules to overhaul the water right permit and change application process.

Here's what you need to know.

Process for Water Right Permit and Change Applications:



Elimination of timeline "black holes."

The permit and change application review process has been shortened significantly. This is accomplished through clear statutory timelines for each step in the process. As a result, all timeline extensions and waivers have been eliminated except one: under 85-2-307(3), an applicant may request an extension of time of up to 180 days to submit additional information after the issuance of a draft preliminary determination.

> New Options for Applicants

There are now multiple pathways through the Department's review process. Permit and change applicants can choose:

1. WHETHER TO HAVE THE DEPARTMENT CONDUCT THE TECHNICAL ANALYSES OR SUPPLY THEIR OWN TECHNICAL ANALYSES

Under the new rules, the Department performs the technical analyses unless the applicant elects to provide their own. This is intended to save applicants the energy and expense of hiring experts, while also increasing the consistency and efficiency of the Department's determinations. For applicants electing to provide their own technical analyses, the Department is making its manuals, standard practice documents, technical memos, and more accessible online so that applicants know how their analyses will be reviewed.

Key Changes from the pre-2024 Process

2. WHETHER TO COMPLETE A PREAPPLICATION MEETING OR NOT.

Benefits of the preapplication meeting:

✓ Increased Predictability

During the preapplication period, the Department either completes the necessary technical analyses or assesses the scientific credibility of applicant-provided technical analyses, so applicants have the certainty of knowing DNRC has signed off on the technical analyses.

> Changes to the Public Notice and Objection Process.

For applications filed after January 1, 2024,

- A 30-day public comment period will be held on the Department's draft preliminary determination.
- If public comments are received, the Department will consider them and then notice the preliminary determination for objections.
- If no valid public comments are received, the draft preliminary determination is adopted as final.

The result: potentially impacted water users can voice concerns earlier in the process. DNRC will be able to consider and address public comments on decision documents prior to the formal hearings process. This leads to better decisions and reduces the costs for potential objectors.

To make it easy for existing water users to stay informed about applications in their area, DNRC developed the Water Rights Notification Tool (WRNT). Using the WRNT, you can customize your settings and receive email notifications when a relevant permit or change is moving through key milestones in the application process. Visit <u>dnrc.mt.gov/wrnt</u> to sign up.

Considerations During the Transition Period.

Applications will be processed using the statutes and rules in effect at the time of application receipt. This means that there will be period of time over the next year or more where pending applications will be on different procedural tracks depending on when they were filed. For example, applications received prior to January 1, 2024 will not be noticed for public comment or be subject to expedited timelines.
